


Enabling Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)

Stage 1 – Initial Setup

Go to the MFA setup page and configure the Authenticator App and Security Key. Please refer to the attached screenshots for guidance.

Stage 2 – Enable Email

- After confirming students have set up the Authenticator App and Security Key, enable Email MFA.
- Important: Once Email MFA is active, it becomes mandatory for login. If students haven't set up the other methods and lose access to their email, they may be locked out.
